THE MONITORING RESULTS SHOW THE MAIN TRENDS IN THE EDITORIAL POLICY OF THE PUBLIC BROADCASTER:

- In news programs, election subjects are covered according to their activities.
- Analytical programs and talk shows focus more on the coverage of parties that remain outside the attention of voters in a polarized election environment and media environment.
- Against the background of sharply polarized election actors, the highest percentage of the broadcaster's coverage tone is neutral.

The First Channel and Georgian Radio have been monitoring all news and socio-political programs since September 1st, and the aim is to count the quantitative data of the time allocated to the monitored subjects.

It is important that monitoring is done through a specially designed program, with links to the TV shows / stories attached. Monitors trained in the specifics of different platforms and shows are monitoring and process both Prime Time and Off Prime information.

THE SUBJECTS OF MONITORING ARE:

- Parties / blocs registered with the CEC for the 2020 parliamentary elections of Georgia
- Majoritarian candidates nominated by Initiative Groups for Parliamentary Elections, and registered at the CEC
- Election subjects registered with the CEC for the Sakrebulo By-elections and Extraordinary Mayoral Elections
- Election subjects of the Supreme Council of the Autonomous Republic of Adjara
- Government
- Parliament
- President
- Local governments
- CEC
- NGOs
- International organizations

| MONITORING METHODOLOGY

Quantitative data of election monitoring include the time allotted to the subject (speaker), and direct and indirect coverage according to the time allotted and the tone of coverage (positive, negative, neutral). It must be explained that the time allotted to the subject (speaker) is a direct coverage of the subject. We are highlighting this data to focus on the percentage of time allocated to election subjects by the broadcaster.

- IT IS CONSIDERED DIRECT COVERAGE WHEN THE SUBJECT SPEAKS HIMSELF
- IT IS CONSIDERED INDIRECT COVERAGE WHEN OTHERS TALK ABOUT THE SUBJECT

The monitor separately marks all the objects mentioned by the subject, indicating the timing and the tone of coverage. Timing is not rounded during election monitoring. When determining the tone of coverage:

- STATEMENTS ARE CONSIDERED NEGATIVE IF THE SPEAKER IS USING HARSH WORDS WITH NEGATIVE CONNOTATIONS
- STATEMENTS ARE CONSIDERED POSITIVE IF THE SPEAKER IS USING WORDS WITH POSITIVE CONNOTATIONS
- THE DESCRIPTION OF THE SITUATION, THE ESTABLISHMENT OF FACTS, AS WELL AS INFORMATION THAT DESCRIBES EVENTS WITHOUT THE USE OF POSITIVE AND NEGATIVE CONNOTATIONS IS CONSIDERED NEUTRAL.

Monitoring reflects the assessment of the total time allocated to the subjects according to the tone, as well as the time and tone of the coverage / mentioning of the subjects by the journalist.

Here is the whole report of the pre-election monitoring of the First Channel and Georgian Radio. The report also includes monitoring of the subjects covered by the First Channel in terms of gender and monitoring of free advertising time used by election subjects on the First Channel and Georgian Radio.

The report includes all the monitored subjects featured both in the election-related and unrelated topics in daily “Moambe” news program all the seven programs “Moambe” .

| THE ELECTION SUBJECTS OF MONITORING

The monitored election subjects are organized in groups in the report. In addition to registered parties / blocs, they include the total duration of coverage of majoritarian candidates nominated by initiative groups (presented in the report as independent MP candidates), the time allotted to sakrebulo by-elections, and early mayoral election subjects in total (presented in the report as local government elections), and total time devoted to the election subjects of the Supreme Council of Adjara (presented in the report as the elections of the Supreme Council of Adjara).

The parties / blocs are indicated by the names under which they participate in the elections. The data is taken from the official website of the CEC.

During the report period, the number of election topics covered in all issues of Moambe was 1712, with allotted time of 50:00:21 (Fifty hours, zero minutes and twenty-one seconds).

According to the monitoring data, the coverage is carried out in accordance with the activity of the election subjects. A total of 52 monitored subjects were covered, including 49 registered parties / blocs. The time allotted to the presented election subjects (speakers) in Moambe is 23:29:50 (Twenty-three hours, twenty-nine minutes, and fifty seconds).

“Georgian Dream - Democratic Georgia” has the highest score (3:54:46), The bloc United National Movement - United Opposition “Strength is in Unity” (3:29:00) is in second place, Bakradze, Ugulava, Bokeria - “European Georgia - Movement for Liberty” (3:21:33) is in third place. These are the three entities with the most activities of the current election campaign, their activities are proportionally reflected in the Moambe, and accordingly can be seen in the monitoring results. At the same time, the observation of the dynamics of the election subjects coverage shows that the pre-election campaign of “Georgian Dream-Democratic Georgia” entered the most active phase two weeks before the elections and, therefore, was promoted among the competing subjects.

Time dedicated to the indirect coverage of election subjects was 18:09:51 (Eighteen hours, nine minutes and fifty-one seconds). The party “Georgian Dream - Democratic Georgia” has the highest indirect coverage (5:43:21), which means that other monitoring entities devoted the most time to talking about the Georgian Dream. In the second place is the bloc “United National Movement - United Opposition “Strength is in Unity” (3:58:44); in the third place is “Bakradze, Ugulava, Bokeria - “European Georgia - Movement for Liberty” (1:43:19).

The monitoring revealed indirect coverage of the opposition in general (01:43:43). This amount does not apply to any political entity, and therefore is not included in the overall data.

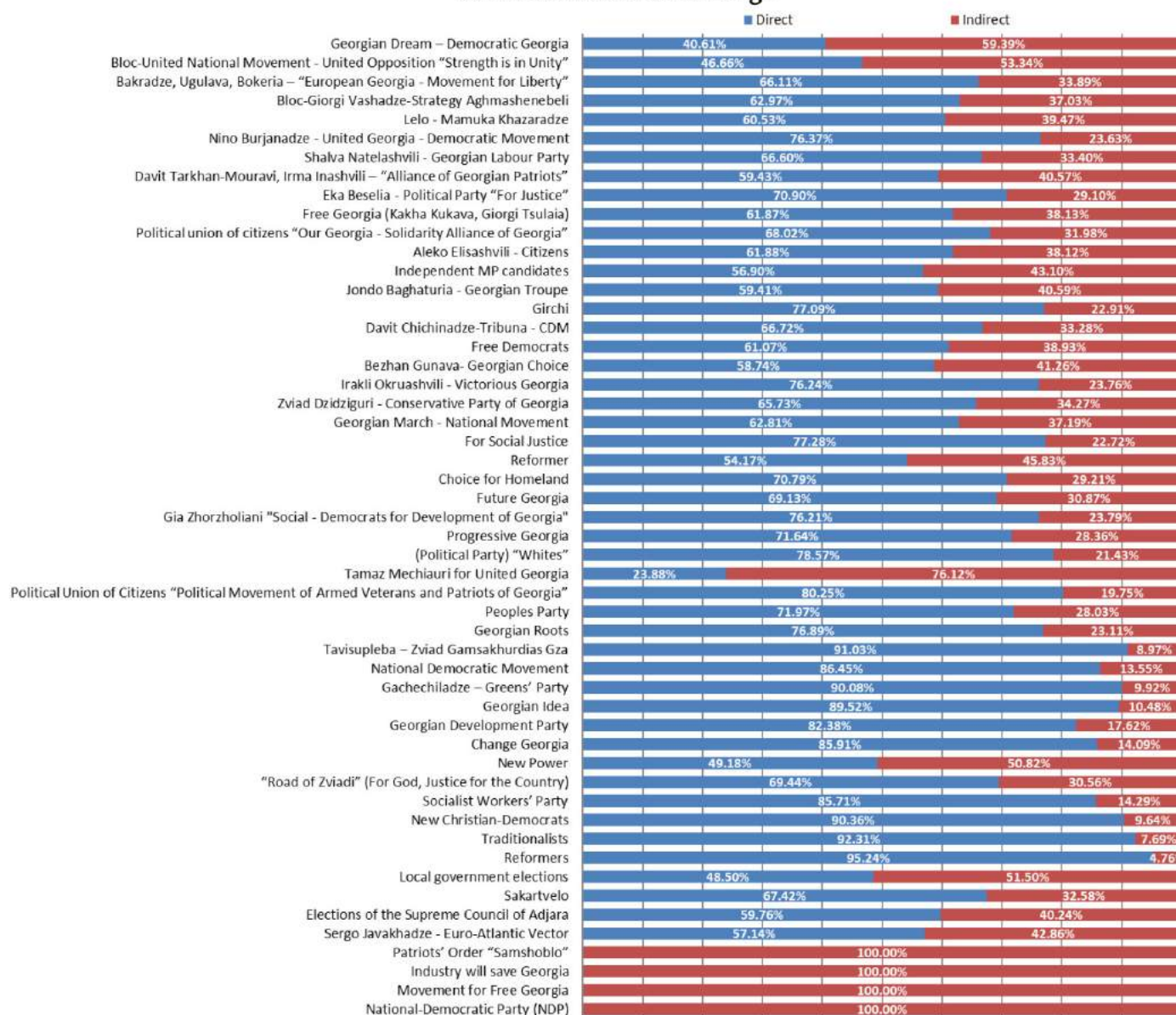

Direct and indirect coverage



The election subjects during the election campaign are characterized by sharp polarization towards each other. This was also reflected in the data received during the monitoring. According to the tone of the subjects' coverage, the highest negative rate was observed towards the "Georgian Dream - Democratic Georgia" (2:41:12). The most negative speeches against this party were from: "United National Movement", "Bakradze, Ugulava, Bokeria - European Georgia - Movement for Liberty", "Lelo - Mamuka Khazaradze", and "Giorgi Vashadze-Strategy Aghmashenebeli"; The United National Movement - United Opposition "Strength is in Unity" is in the second place with the second highest negative rate (1:25:24). The negative speeches against this bloc were from: "Georgian Dream - Democratic Georgia", "Davit Tarkhan-Mouravi, Irma Inashvili - Alliance of Georgian Patriots", and "Bakradze, Ugulava, Bokeria - European Georgia - Movement for Liberty".

Despite the context of strongly polarized election actors, the highest percentage of the broadcaster's coverage tone is neutral.

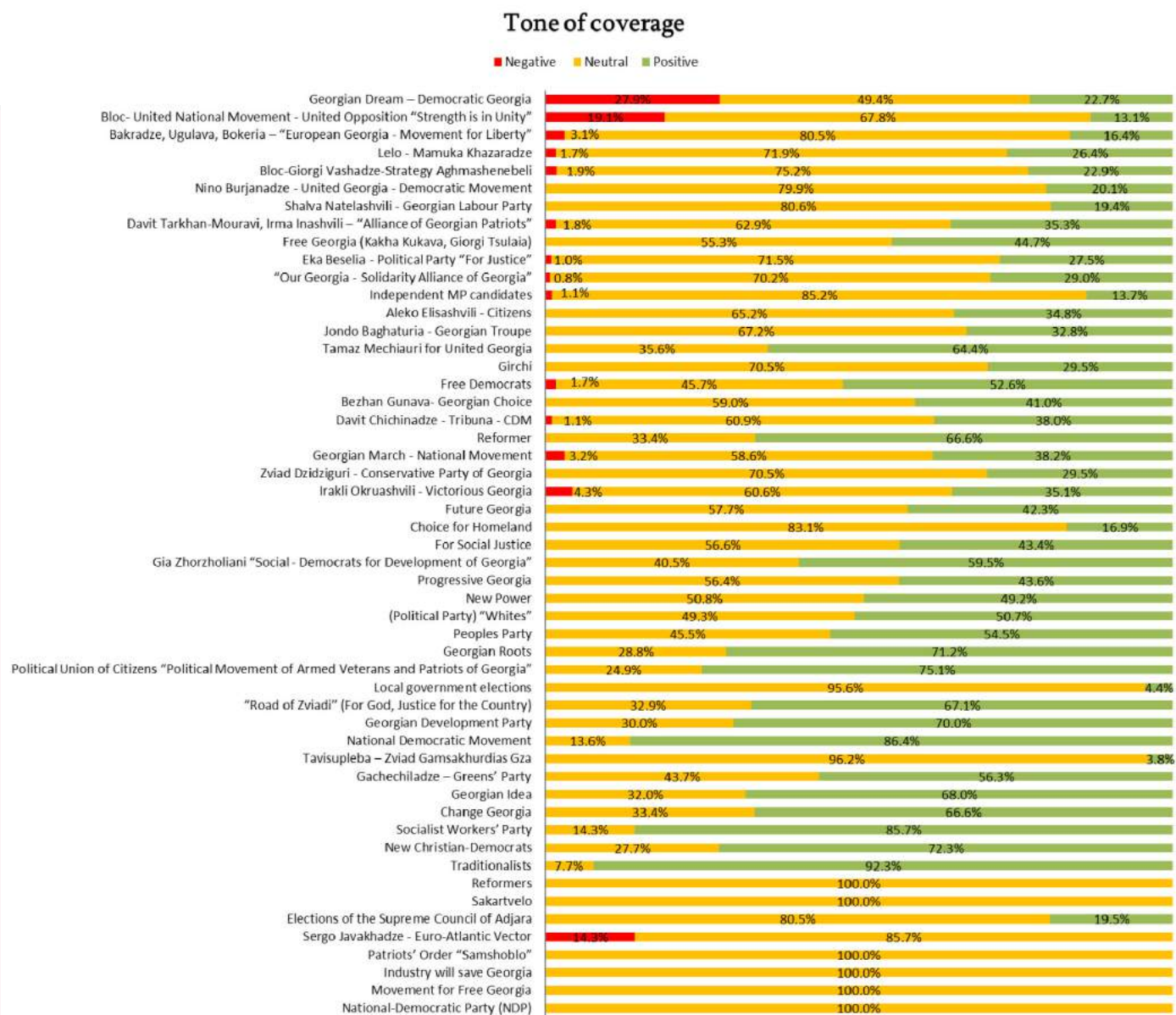

From September 30, Moambe (21:00) equally devoted 5 minutes of time to each qualified and unqualified election subjects, and they were given the opportunity to introduce their program and key messages to voters. 45 political parties used the time allocated by Moambe. 6 parties refused to use the opportunity.

THE NON-ELECTION SUBJECTS OF MONITORING

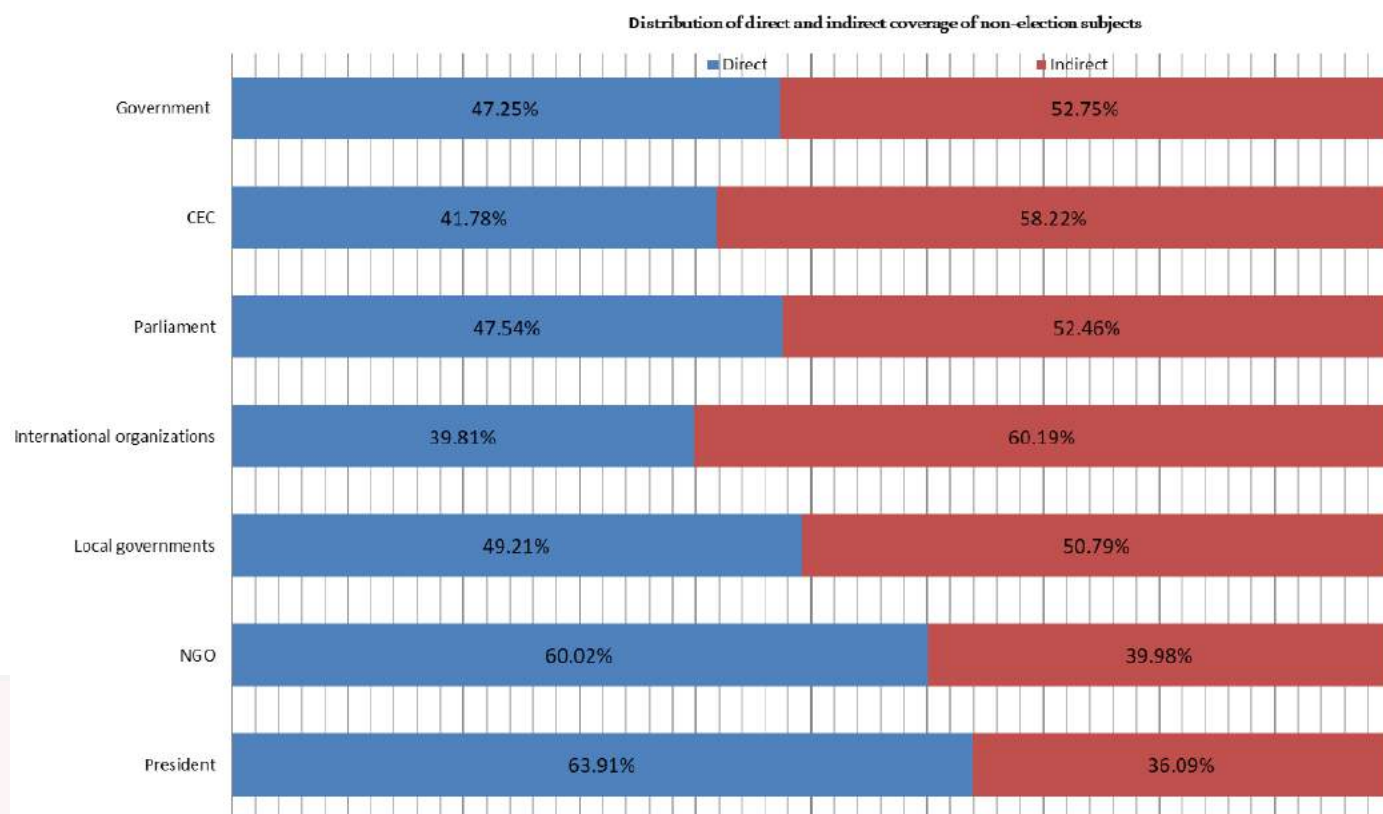
In the pre-election period, in addition to the election subjects, representatives of the government, parliament, the Presidential Office, the CEC, international and non-governmental organizations communicate with the voters. The report shows the direct and indirect coverage of non-election subjects in all issues of Moambe.

The spokespersons of the government in the monitoring process include the Prime Minister, the Ministers, the Deputy Ministers, the State Representatives / Acting Representatives.

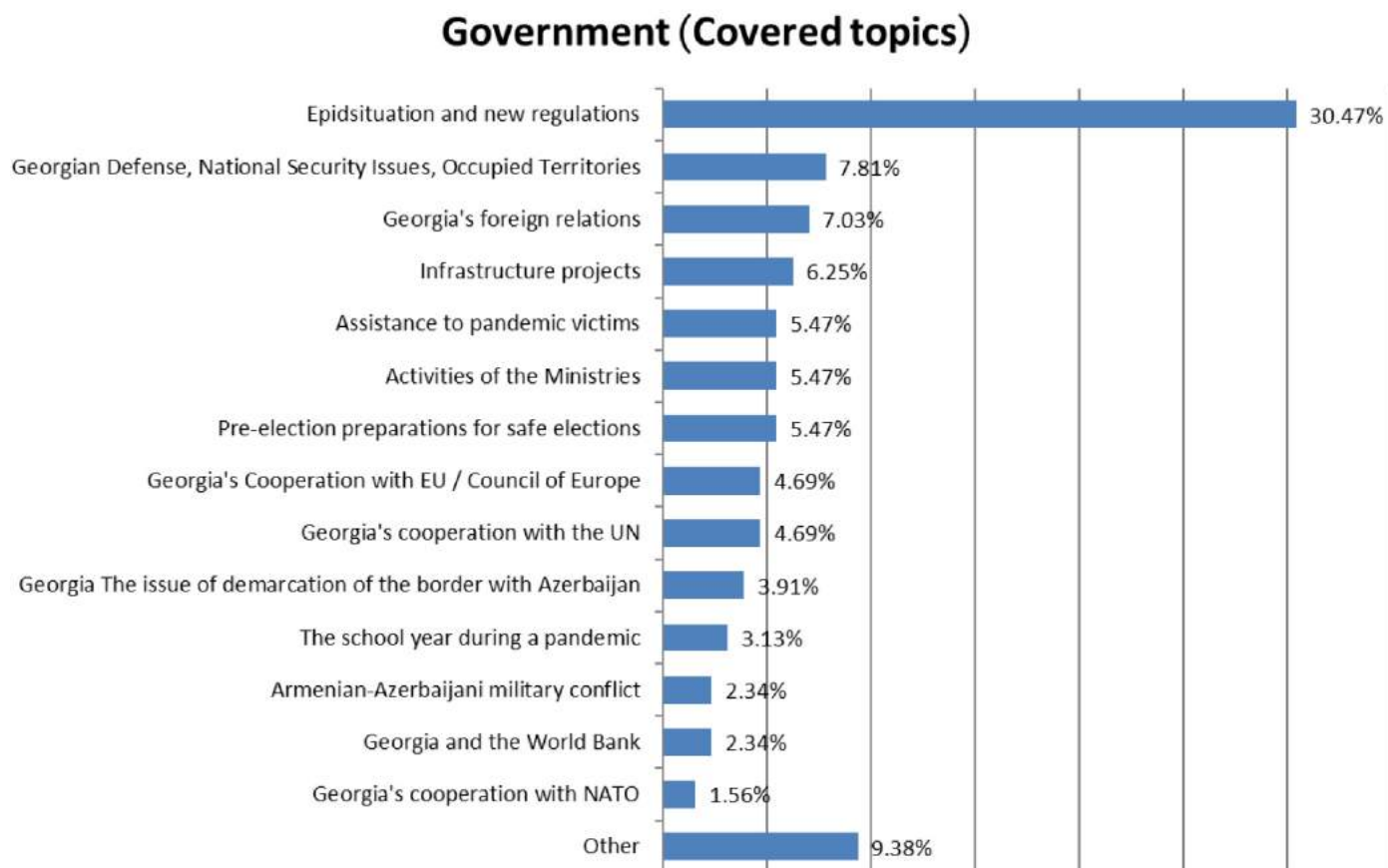

The report provides a thematic overview of government coverage. 100% indicates the total amount of information covered during the reporting period. Moambe covered topics of high public interest, such as the epidemiological situation and new regulations (30.47%). Regarding these topics, members of the government made statements at government meetings and Coordination Council meetings. In addition to the epidemiological situation, Georgia's defense and national security issues were actively covered during the reporting period (7.81%), Foreign relations (7.03%), infrastructure projects (6.25%), the demarcation issue of the Georgian-Azerbaijani border (3.91%), and the Armenian-Azerbaijani military conflict (2.34%) have been topical lately, as government members have been regularly making announcements.

Category "Other" (9.38%) Covered: Landslide in Khelvachauri, special operation in Zugdidi, revisions to the Civil Code, cultural events.

ANALYTICAL SHOWS / TALK SHOWS

Pre-election monitoring included First Channel's analytical shows and talk shows: Debates 2020, Current Topic, Weekly Interview, Free Vision, Real Space, Washington Today, New Week.

Monitoring Methodology: Direct coverage of election subjects was measured in analytical programs and talk shows. The time allotted to the subject was considered the full timing of each show the speaker was invited to.

In contrast to the Moambe editorial policy, which covered election subjects according to their activity, analytical programs and talk shows focused more on parties that remained out of the voters' attention in a polarized electoral and media environment. First Channel policies ensured that these parties were represented, that voters were informed about their election programs, and thus highlighted the importance of a multi-party electoral process.

Both qualified and unqualified election subjects were invited to the pre-election talk show "Debates 2020" of the First Channel. The participants of the debates were selected based on the principle of the lottery. 42 election subjects participated in the program.

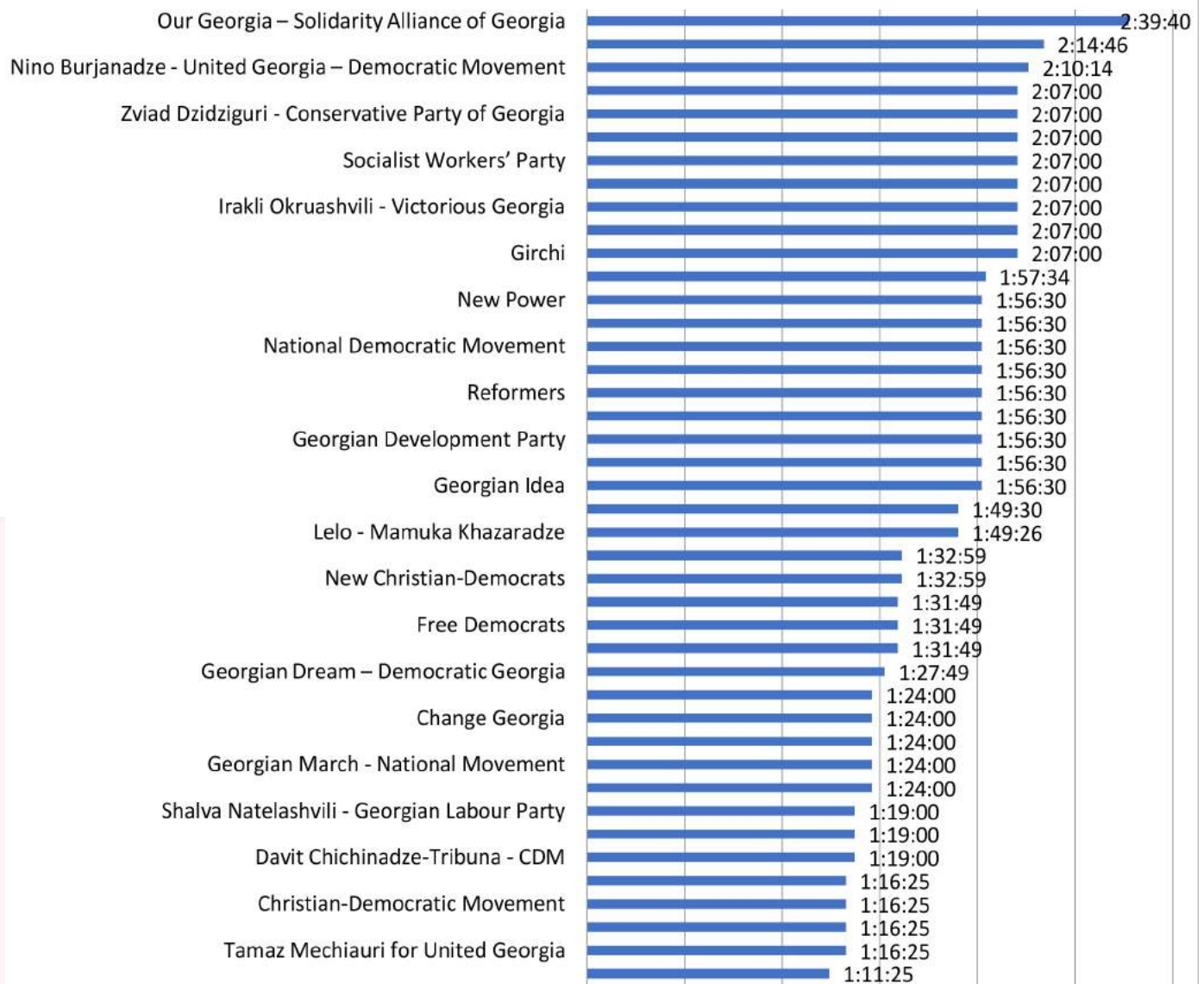

COVERAGE OF MONITORED SUBJECTS BY GENDER

Here is presented the quantitative data of the monitored subjects (speakers) of all socio-political directions of the First Channel, by gender.

In addition to the monitored subjects, the presenters of the program, the journalists, and the experts of the First Channel were observed in terms of gender.

THE REPORT REFLECTED:

- ALL ISSUES OF MOAMBE (MOAMBE (08:00), MOAMBE (09:00), MOAMBE (10:00), MOAMBE (12:00), MOAMBE (15:00), MOAMBE (18:00), MOAMBE (21:00))
- ANALYTICAL SHOWS AND TALK SHOWS: DEBATES 2020, CURRENT TOPIC, WEEKLY INTERVIEW, FREE VISION, REAL SPACE, WASHINGTON TODAY, NEW WEEK.

Although funding for parties staffed by voluntary gender quotas has increased from 10 to 30 percent, pre-election monitoring results show that men remain the most active speakers in electoral subjects.

According to the monitoring results, direct coverage of women is significantly higher than indirect coverage.

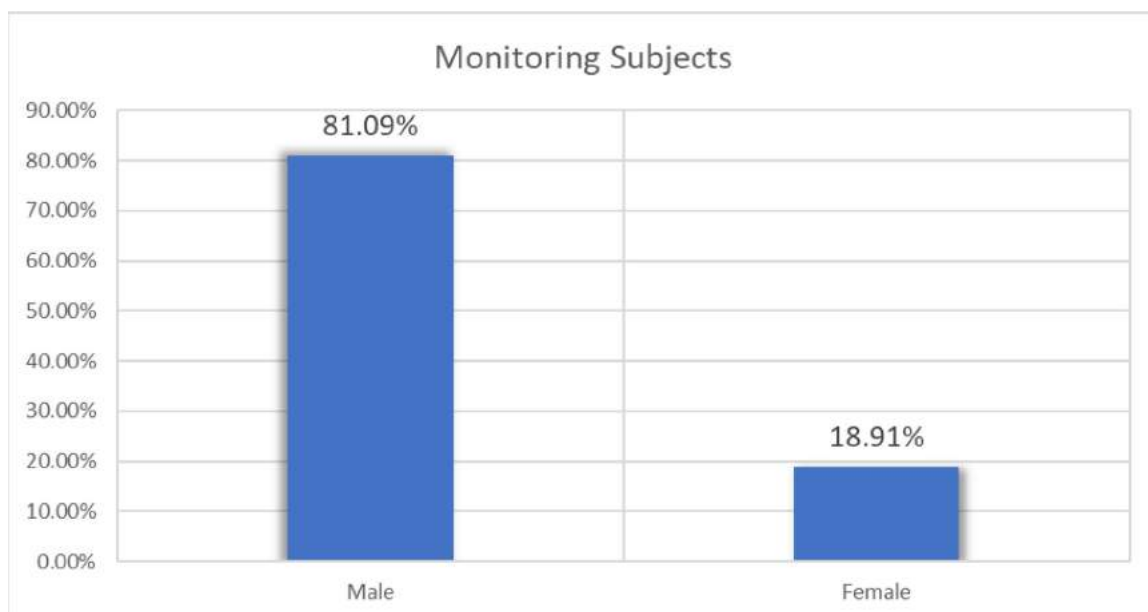

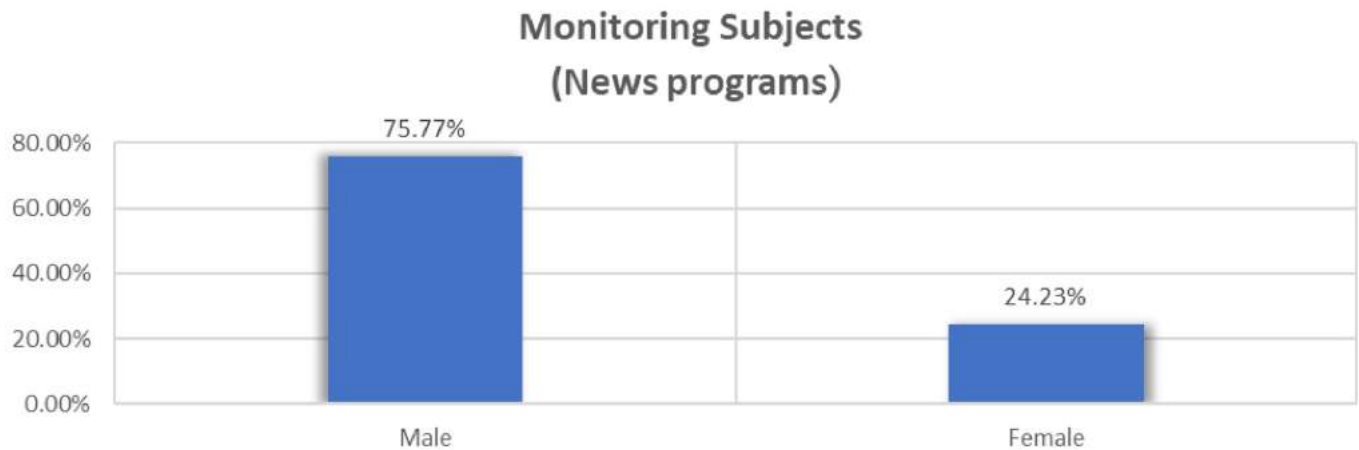

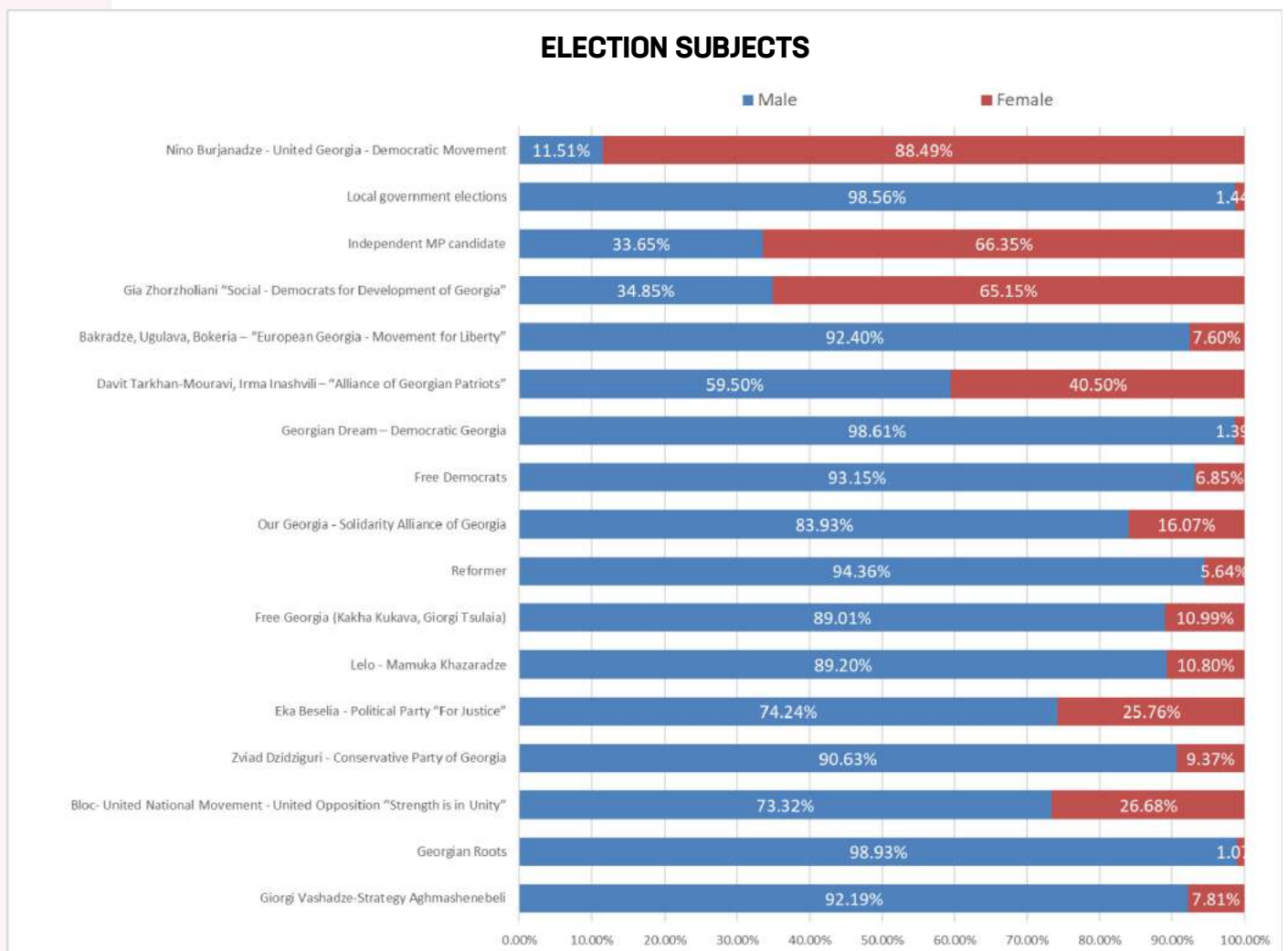
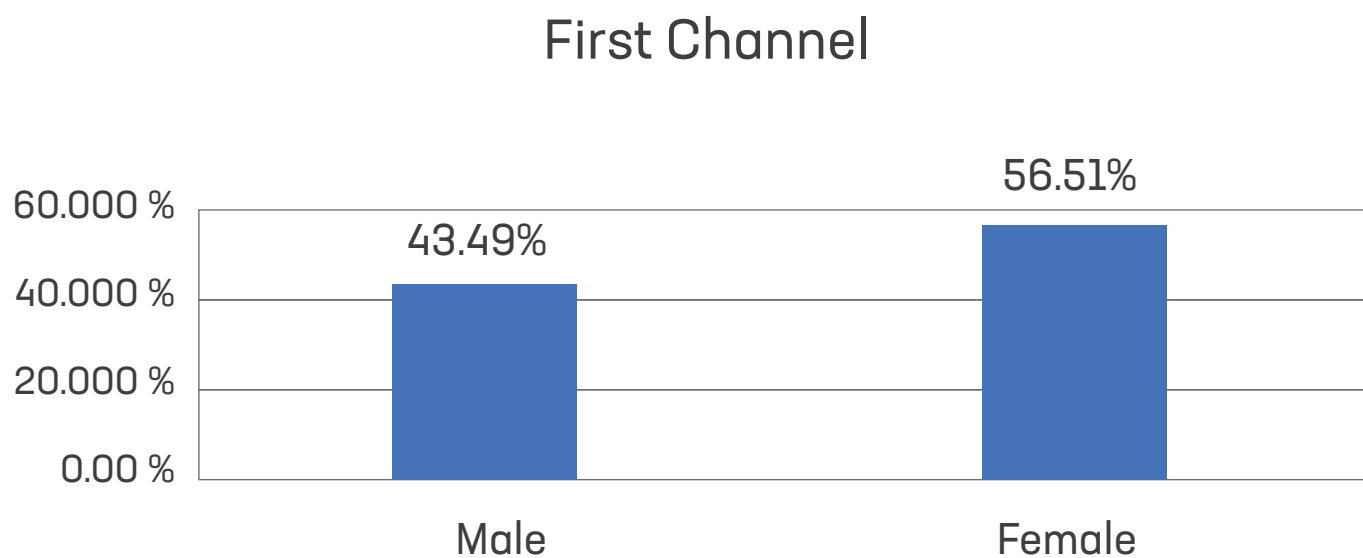

Quantitative data of Radio Election Monitoring include the time allotted to the subject (speaker), and direct and indirect coverage according to the time allotted and the tone of coverage (positive, negative, neutral). It must be explained that the time allotted to the subject (speaker) is a direct coverage of the subject. We are highlighting this data to focus on the percentage of time allocated to election subjects by broadcaster.

Due to the format of the news programs of “Georgian Radio”, during the monitoring, the subjects of the covered information were considered as speakers, and the time allotted to them was considered as direct coverage. The monitors marked the subjects of the covered information and all the objects mentioned by them separately, indicating the timing and tone of coverage. The time allotted to objects is considered indirect coverage. Timing is not rounded during election monitoring.

Monitoring reflects the assessment of the total time allocated to the subjects according to the tone, as well as the time and tone of the coverage / mentioning of the subjects by the journalist.

The presented report reflected 33 daily news programs of “Georgian Radio” and the talk show “Elections 2020”.

NEWS PROGRAMS

Every working day, 15 minutes per hour is devoted to news programs on Georgian Radio. Among them are 17- 10 minute and 16- 5 minute programs. There is a 17- 10 minute program on non-working days.

In addition to the parties / blocs registered with the CEC, the report includes the total duration of coverage of majoritarian candidates nominated by initiative groups, the total time allotted to the subjects of sakrebulo by-elections and extraordinary mayoral elections, and the total time allotted to the Supreme Council of Adjara election subjects.

The parties / blocs are indicated by the names under which they participate in the elections. The data is taken from the official website of the CEC.

The number of election topics covered in news programs during the reporting period was 6,906, with a time allotted of 43:00:07 (forty-three hours, zero minutes, and seven seconds). According to the monitoring data, a total of 41 monitored subjects were covered, including 38 registered parties / blocs. The time allotted to the presented election subjects (speakers) in News program is 18:42:21 (Eighteen hours, forty-two minutes and twenty-one seconds).

“Georgian Dream - Democratic Georgia” (3:49:10) has the highest score, Bakradze, Ugulava, Bokeria - “European Georgia - Movement for Liberty” (3:08:16) is in second place, the bloc United National Movement - United Opposition “Strength is in Unity” (2:55:17) is in third place. These are the three entities with the most activities of the current election campaign.

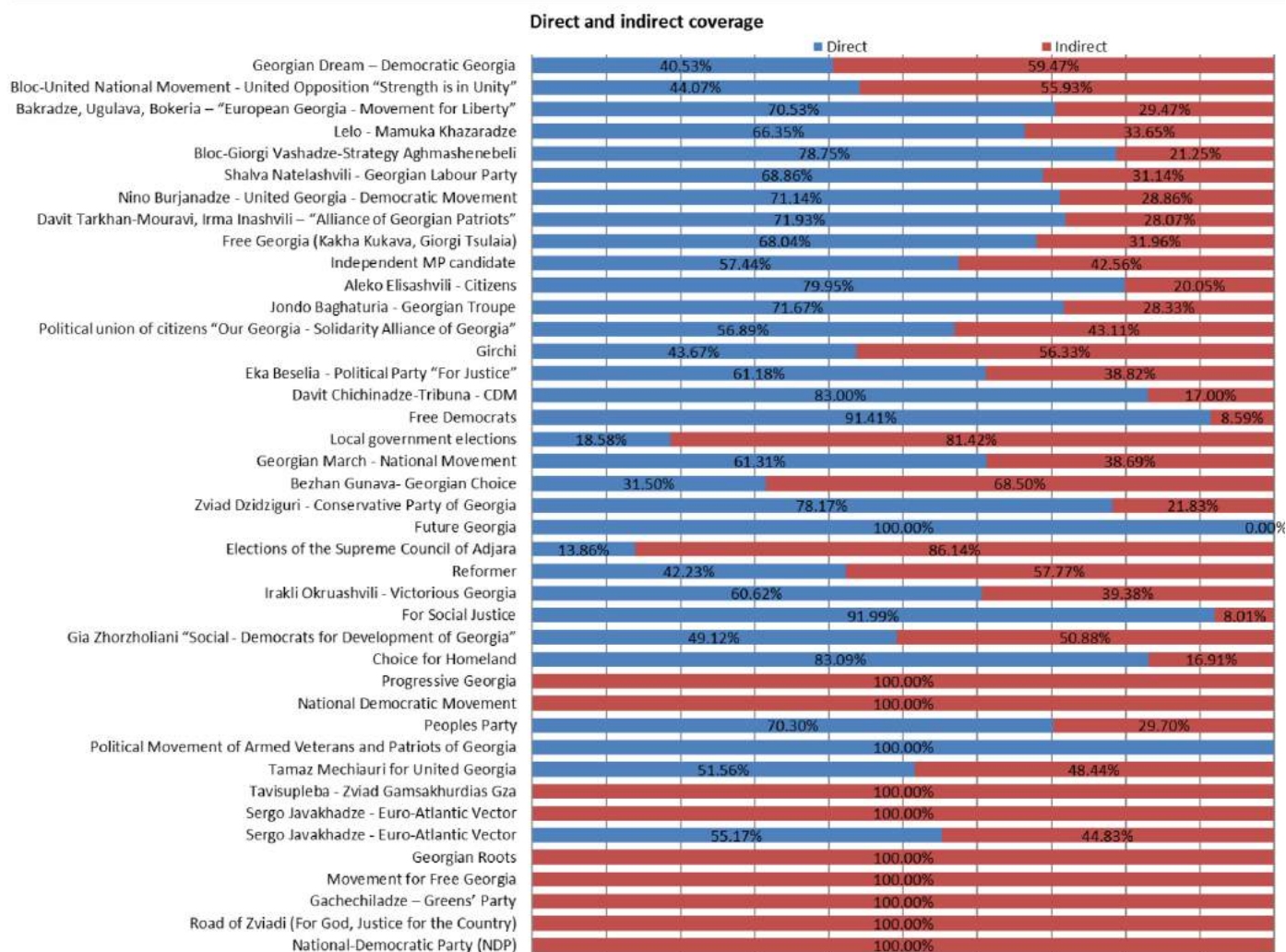
Time dedicated to the indirect coverage of election subjects was 14:55:37 (Fourteen hours, fifty-five minutes and thirty-seven seconds). The party “Georgian Dream - Democratic Georgia” has the highest indirect coverage (5:36:13), which means that other monitoring entities devoted the most time to talking about the Georgian Dream. In the second place is the bloc “United National Movement - United Opposition “Strength is in Unity” (3:42:28), in the third place is “Bakradze, Ugulava, Bokeria - “European Georgia - Movement for Liberty” (1:18:41).

The election subjects during the election campaign are characterized by sharp polarization towards each other. This was also reflected in the data received during the monitoring. According to the tone of the subjects’ coverage, the highest negative rate both in television and in radio programs was observed towards the “Georgian Dream - Democratic Georgia” [2:07:53]. The most negative speeches against this party were from: “Bakradze, Ugulava, Bokeria - European Georgia - Movement for Liberty”, “United National Movement”, and “Lelo - Mamuka Khazaradze”; The United National Movement - United Opposition “Strength is in Unity” is in the second place with the second highest negative rate. [1:21:02] The negative speeches against this bloc were from: “Georgian Dream - Democratic Georgia”, “Bakradze, Ugulava, Bokeria - European Georgia - Movement for Liberty”, and Davit Tarkhan-Mouravi, Irma Inashvili - “Alliance of Georgian Patriots”.

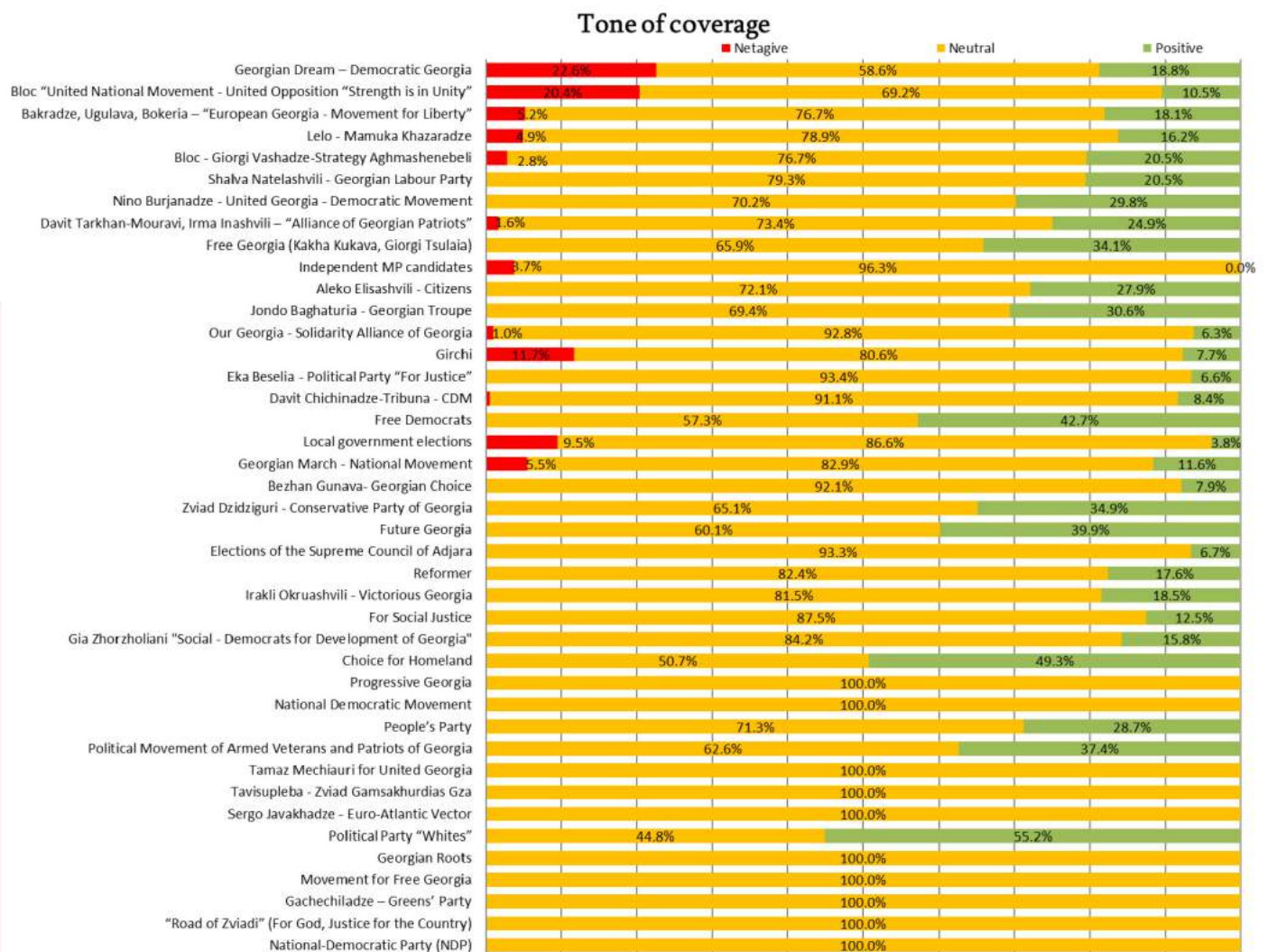
Against the background of sharply polarized election actors, the highest percentage of the broadcaster’s coverage is neutral on the radio as well as on television.

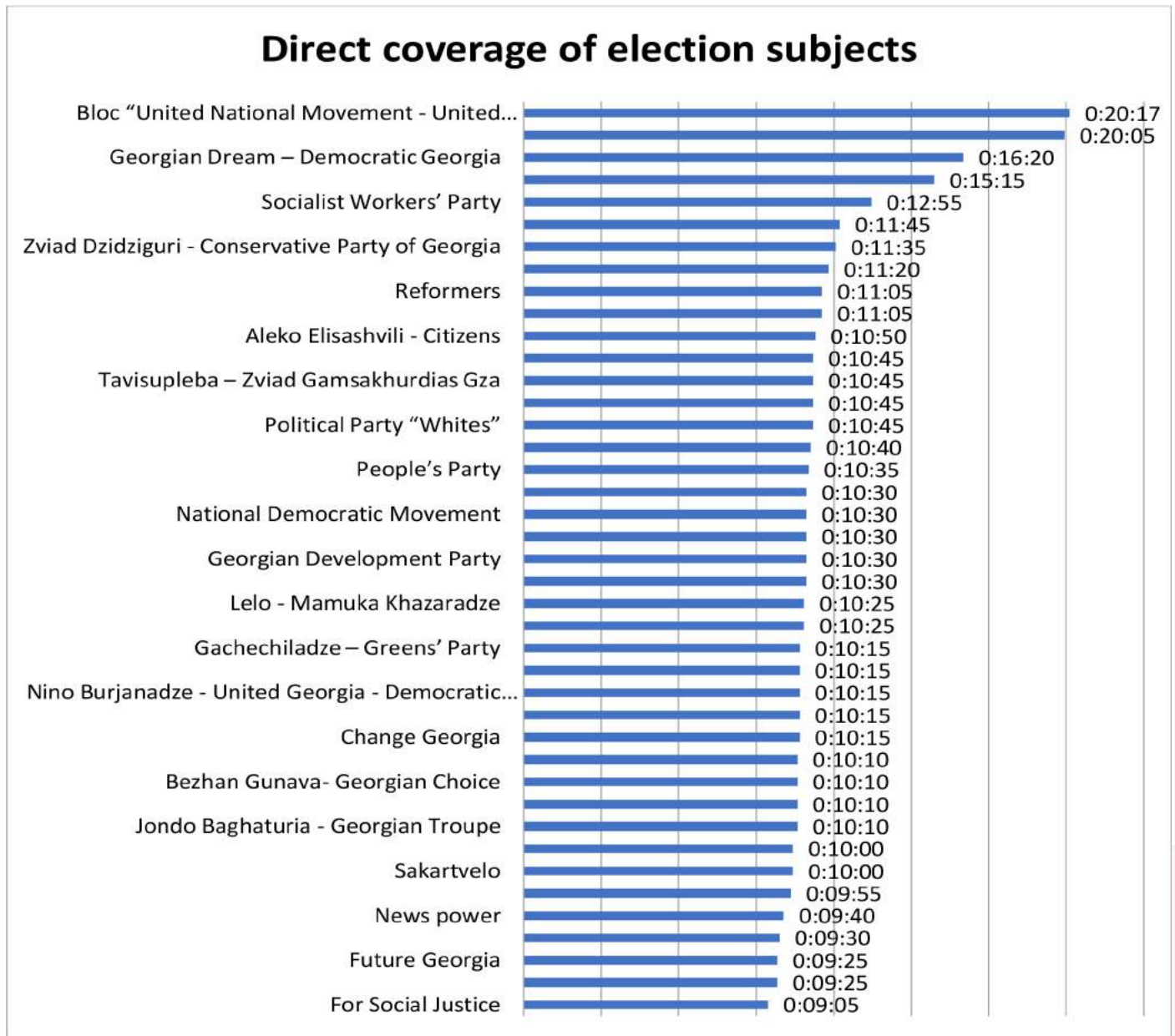


In the pre-election period, the role of broadcasters in informing voters is increasing. Particular importance is attached to the impartial editorial policy, which is clearly seen in the tone of coverage of journalists / presenters and the redistribution of time devoted to subjects. During the monitoring, the observation objects were the journalists of the broadcaster and the presenters of the programs. It should be noted that the tone of the journalists of the news programs of “Georgian Radio” is marked by high neutral indicators towards all election subjects.

From September 11, the Public Broadcaster allocated 5 minutes per hour for free pre-election advertisements on the First Channel and Georgian Radio (FM 102.3) and 2.5 minutes per hour for all parties / blocs except for the qualified election subjects;
During the pre-election period, no complaints were received by the Public Broadcaster regarding the elections;

Information was posted weekly on the Communications and Broadcasting website.
Paid political advertising was not placed.
